

Cleveland Bay Wool Dumping Company Archive

Wool Dumping is a process by which wool bales are compressed into a smaller package size – a dumped unit – such that more bales can fit into a container. The Cleveland Bay Wool Dumping Company operated in the White Shed, premises leased from the Harbour Board. The company was a local company established in 1922 and provided growers with a more direct route to overseas markets. The company was active until the 1950's.
