



As I leave, the Chamber remains in good operational conditions, although membership numbers have suffered due to the ongoing business uncertainty. To all our members, thank you for your support; and for non-members, support us so we can support you and the business and industry community. The Chamber's motto is to make business connections and we keep striving to deliver our mission and be relevant. This year, the Chamber, through its Executive Officer Marie-Claude Brown, has initiated a number of studies including the establishment of an innovation hub in the CBD as part of our commitment to developing the city's economic strengths. It is hoped that Council's purchase of the railway yards and the development proposed for the site will result in opportunities for technology innovators and creators to find a home in Townsville.

The other major Chamber study has been about better transport connectivity between the CBD and the Douglas Knowledge Precinct and a better experience for public transport users in general. With the steady increase of people living

in Townsville, we advocate for a better public transport system, including a major bus and taxi stop in Ogden Street. The State Government is currently investigating all proposed sites for the stop and we look forward to a positive outcome for the city in the New Year.

I have enjoyed my time as President and look

forward to handing over the baton, although I will remain as Immediate Past President for the next two years. I would like to thank the Chamber Board, our Executive Officer, and the Chamber Staff for their tireless effort and support.

City Economic Development and Planning

Home to more than 185,000 people, Townsville remains a vibrant and dynamic regional destination with much potential.

It is important then to ensure that deliberate planning strategies are introduced to maintain and enhance the lifestyle options and natural assets of the North, while guiding infrastructure provision and investment decisions.

A key component in directing outcomes is the Planning Scheme and, earlier this year, Townsville City Council released its Draft City Plan which sets out a strategic framework for the growth of the City.

It is a vital document that provides a regulatory path for business to undertake development in Townsville, providing land use allocations and assessment levels that promote economic development opportunity.

Council's Strategic Framework seeks to accommodate about 45,000 new homes over the next 25 years. Demographic changes over time mean that changes to housing options will be required and the City Plan responds to this by delivering options in both defined greenfield and infill locations.

The City Plan anticipates about 50,000 new jobs are required by 2031 and key productive precincts are promoted at the CBD, Port of Townsville, James Cook University, Lavarack Barracks, Townsville Airport and Aitkenvale, Thuringowa Central and Hyde Park Major Centres.

The City Plan emphasises the significance of the CBD which is to be a cornerstone in Townsville's evolution and it encourages investment in a diverse range of city uses to continue its revitalisation.

Other major centres at Aitkenvale, Thuringowa Central and Hyde Park and, in time, at Burdell and Rocky Springs are also planned to evolve and are intended to broaden their function beyond shopping to offer greater mixed use development to create a hub to live, work, recreate and access services.

The Chamber looks forward to the adoption of the final Scheme in the first half of 2014 to provide certainty as we move towards 2031.

CBD Vision 30/30



The Townsville Chamber has been advocating for a revitalised CBD for the past 10 years. Although the first few years showed little evidence of our efforts, the area has grown by leaps and bounds since 2010.

In order to grow civically, culturally, commercially and socially, Townsville needed a Central Business District and we pursued that agenda relentlessly. Our efforts were not just on behalf of retailers located on Flinders or Stokes Streets, but on behalf of Townsville's business and industry community, where ever they operated. We all needed a CBD.

Now that we have one, we need to insure its future through good planning and strategic development. A goal has been set to have 30,000 people living and working in the CBD by 2030, the 30/30 Vision. At 6.1% real growth per annum, this is well above the 2% growth target predicted by the Australian Treasury.

Planning for such a growth means more than just adding high-rises to the cityscape. It includes attracting residential, business and development investments - 316 new workers will need approximately 3,500 to 4,500 square meter of new commercial space; 428 new residents will require 200 new residences; while 6,800 new hotel guests will call for 80 more hotel rooms every year. It also means providing for adequate and viable public as well as private transport; offering reputable and varied educational options; maintaining the sustainability of our resources; and having attractive public spaces and social infrastructures.

The Chamber conducted two scoping studies in 2013 to progress the development of public transport and that of an education and innovation hub in the CBD. The studies were made possible through a grant from the Department of State Development, Infrastructure and Planning.

Property and Construction **Overview**



The wider Townsville property market has again provided a resilience that other regional cities are simply unable to offer.

Sales activity and development approvals for both commercial and residential property in 2013 have seen positives from almost every sector, with the completion and commencement of some significant construction projects across the residential, commercial office and retails sectors.

Townsville City Council Building Approvals - April 2005 - August 2013.

Major projects include the addition of approximately 22,000m2 of commercial office accommodation in the CBD, the commencement of the new Quest Hotel on Eyre Street, the addition of the Coles shopping centre in Kirwan and the commencement of several major residential projects including Allure, Paddington, Riverside Gardens, Castle Point and Spring Bank Urban Village.

Moderate sales and rental activity for commercial property across the city has occurred with an increase in incentives required by landlords to attract tenants. The urban renewal of the CBD has seen the refurbishment of several commercial buildings both by owner occupiers and commercial investors.

Residential dwelling approvals are estimated to reach approximately 1,100 for the 2013 calendar year which is below the average annual dwelling approvals since January 2001, and generally in line with the long term averages recorded since 1981.

Whilst detached dwelling approvals are trending near longer term averages, sales activity for established residential dwellings during 2013 is estimated to reach 2,600 sales, well below sales activity recorded since 2000.





2013 has again proved to be very challenging for small to medium business in the Townsville and North Queensland region. The term 'patchy' was very prominent throughout the year, with some businesses able to achieve good results in difficult trading conditions and take opportunities in a very wide market space.

From a professional services and finance industry point of view, managing client's expectations whilst trying to deal with uncertain political environments, given the length of time for the federal election, was a challenge. For many businesses, these conditions resulted in having to operate in very tough conditions with mixed results. Professional service providers could be forgiven for feeling more like

psychologists than business advisors.

Cash flow management was very important and relationships with financiers were paramount for the business community to keep trading throughout the year. Banks continue to be open to lending but on very strict credit control and compliance

With all this said, Townsville continues to sit in a very opportunist and unique position given a widely held economy. The region's economy continues to provide opportunities as well as obvious challenges. We found that businesses that went to market and were able to take opportunities did so on the back of strong professional and financial support and very robust and strong reporting management systems. As in prior years, the AON 2013 Global Risk

Management Survey results makes for interesting reading. In 2013, the top three risks over the next three years are -

- 1. Economic slow down and the rate of recovery
- 2. Regulatory and registered of changes
- 3. Increase of competition

The economy will continue to provide small to medium businesses in the Townsville and North Queensland markets with challenges and opportunities. The Chamber looks forward to continue supporting small to medium enterprises to bring business together and help continue the strong community and economy which Townsville and the North Queensland region has.

Transport and Logistics Overview

The 2012-2013 year has seen the completion and continuation of major capital investments in port and logistics chain infrastructure coupled with a number of supply chain initiatives that will significantly enhance capacity

and efficiency of import and export activities into the future. After four years of

construction, the \$217 million Townsville Port Access Road opened in 2012 taking over 500 trucks a day off the city's suburban streets. As a designated heavy vehicle route, this new road provides trucks and road trains access to the port 24 hours a day, seven days a week which has improved freight efficiency and will boost the productivity of the region's agricultural and resources industries.

The Port Corporation completed a \$40 million upgrade of Berth 8 during the year to cater for panamax vessels and to enable the construction of a new shiploader and conveyors by Mount Isa Mines Limited (MIM) for handling bulk minerals and fertiliser. In addition, the \$85 million upgrade of Berth 10 is nearing completion, which will significantly improve capability for cruise and defence operations and provide increased capacity for commercial shipping.

Environmental approvals for Berth 12 have been secured, and planning across the logistics chain to cater for growth in bulk trades is well advanced to ensure port and rail infrastructure can be delivered in line with customers' project timelines.

The Corporation also completed an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Townsville Port Expansion Project, which will ensure capacity for the next generation of growth and position Townsville as the vital trade gateway for Northern Australia.

The Corporation has worked in close partnership with our customers and logistics chain partners over the past year to improve freight coordination. Together with the State government, supply chain partners and customers the Corporation is also investigating options to improve efficiency and capacity and to identify and prioritise investment opportunities. In 2013-2014 the benefits of these important measures will begin to flow through to our trade and financial performance.

Resources and Agriculture Overview

Agriculture has been central to the Port of Townsville's trade profile since the port's beginnings on Ross Creek in 1864 to service the growing pastoral industry north of the Burdekin River.

Today, the agricultural sector has given way somewhat to mining and minerals, but remains a principal trade segment of what comes in and out of Townsville.

Of the 12.09 million tonnes of goods handled through the Port of Townsville in the last financial year, sugar exports contributed 1.5 million tonnes and fertiliser exports a further 810,338 tonnes.

Mineral concentrate exports meanwhile totalled 1.7 million tonnes, magnetite exports 773,177 tonnes, and refined metal exports, predominately from Townsville's three refineries, 484,363 tonnes.

Nickel ore at 3.9 million tonnes was the region's major import during the period, followed by petroleum products for industry, local motor vehicles, aircraft and ferries, at 1.1 million tonnes. The region also experienced strong growth in cement, fertiliser, mineral concentrates, copper anodes and sulphuric acid imports.


Moving forward, these sector stalwarts are expected to continue to underwrite the majority of Townsville's throughput as the port continues to grow to service the prospering communities of North Queensland.

The growth outlook for key mineral commodities remains strong as many existing operators and junior miners continue to undertake drilling and feasibility studies for new deposits. Agricultural products are forecast to remain at about 20 per cent of total trade, with a number of new agricultural projects currently being investigated.

Trade Overview

PORT of Townsville Limited has, for some time now, been working hard behind the scenes to establish Townsville as a strategic hub for the import and export of all consumer goods for northern Australia.

Within the stacks of innocuous steel boxes lies the future of that ambition.

Containerised goods – primarily the furniture, whitegoods, and electronics you'll find around your home and workplace – have been a growing segment of Townsville's trade profile since 2006/07. During the last six years, TEUs (Twenty-foot Equivalent Units) in and out of Townsville have grown 267% to 50,173 on the back of improved handling methodologies, infrastructure investments and more regular services.

The recent announcement that Bunning's Warehouse will use Townsville as a transport hub for the distribution of its products throughout northern Queensland speak volumes of the city's competitiveness in this space and adds another layer of legitimacy to our work to attract container trade for North Queensland and away from Brisbane.

The aim to be the nexus of northern supply was enhanced in December 2012 with the completion of the \$214 million Townsville Port Access Road, which has proven to be a critical investment for containerised and project cargo trade by allowing direct road access to the southern and western highways and truck configurations of more than 50 metres to service the port.

The recent upgrade of Wharf 10 also provides additional capacity and flexibility for growth in general cargo and motor vehicles, in addition to giving the city a purpose-built facility for cruise and Defence vessels. This asset will be further augmented from January with the installation of a mobile harbour crane to secure additional trade for the region.

Information Communication Technology (ICT) **Overview**

There has been major activity in Townsville's ICT sector over the past twelve months. Dominating the sector is the continued rollout of the National Broadband Network (NBN). While this high profile, politically charged project has thrown up a number of challenges, the good news is that the rate of domestic connections has increased greatly and the NBN is now focussed on Multi-Dwelling Units (MDUs) and commercial properties.

In the words of NBN, "Townsville is Australia's most NBN-ready city". This puts Townsville in the enviable position to be able to compete favourable with the capital cities based upon telecommunications infrastructure. Added to this is Telstra's rollout of over forty 4G towers before Christmas 2013, which will give the region a major boost in mobile data flow as the use of smart phones and tablets increases dramatically.

2013 was a year of consolidation for Townsville's industry sector groups. Broadband for the Tropics (BftT) was very active in the lead up to the federal election by engaging politicians on both sides of the political divide to promote the NBN rollout and other "tropical technology" related infrastructure projects. The Townsville ICT Business Network (TICTBN) continues to grow and provide an excellent platform for local industry experts to share their experience. Both organisations are confident of a productive 2014.

James Cook University has been very active in 2013. The intake of first year IT students exceeded all expectations and signal a renewed interest in ICT by emerging graduates. The Townsville Knowledge and Innovation Centre, a joint venture between JCU and Anittel to build a world class data centre and academic/industry interaction centre at JCU, received an \$8.9 million funding boost from the Federal Government just before the election. The Research Data Storage Infrastructure project has been configured and is ready to receive masses of data across collaborative facilities to directly benefit the JCU research community. Your Chamber is also actively pursuing an Innovation Hub to be located within the city. It is expected that an Innovation Hub would leverage existing ICT infrastructure and link emerging technology entrepreneurs with businesses to provide a facility which promotes business growth. This

promotes business growth. This is an exciting project which will draw upon Townsville's excellent track record of business development.

The last 12 months have shown signs of improvement in the Travel and Tourism sector. Whilst no actual data is available specifically for Townsville, commentary from Tourism Australia suggests improvement. Qantas, however, adds a cautionary note in that the Australian economy is in transition and therefore affecting corporate clients, especially those from the mining sector and financial services.

The first passenger ship of the Cruise Ship season berthed at the brand new Wharf 10 on Friday 25th October 2013, giving tourism operators another opportunity to sell our region to visitors.

Your Chamber has been working with Townsville Enterprise, Townsville City Council and Tourism operators on committees throughout the year to prepare for this and the many ships that will now visit our region, bringing a boost to our local economy.

We are hopeful the new facility will entice more navy ships to visit and enjoy our local hospitality. Navy ships, or "grey ships", tend to stay longer in port, with each visitor spending an average of \$400 a day while on leave. The retailers in the CBD have been busy forming Citiheart Inc. This small enthusiastic group of retailers have established a working committee with the view to encourage membership of other retailers, and band together to promote the precinct.

Advertising on television is encouraging shoppers to visit the CBD and find their "city heart experience". The Chamber is providing in kind assistance to Cityheart Inc., as they organise and coordinate their precinct's activities. Our view is to encourage a strong retail offer to be available to visitors and tourists, as they stroll through the city.

The region continues to benefit from the "Visiting Friends and Family" (VFF) market. We have benefited from increased visitors, thanks to events like the Australian Festival of Chamber Music, now recognised internationally. Other milestone events, like the inaugural Townsville Fashion Festival, bring new visitors to the area and we can expect to see the local event calendar grow in strength in the coming year.

This year again, the retail sector continues to have two speeds. Retailers are either embracing a "bricks and clicks" combination of a shop front and an online presence. Or they continue to wait for retail conditions to improve as the drop in interest rates perks up consumer confidence and spending.

Big retailers continue to invest new infrastructure dollars in Townsville. A year on, Myer's bet at Stockland has bucked the local retail trends, whilst Willows Shopping Centre has a planned extension and Coles stand alone food centres have opened in Thuringowa and Deeragun.

In franchising, Townsville holds the record as the regional town with the most National Award Winners for Franchise Systems in Australia.

The CBD retail outlook has been boosted by two large office towers with 900 Ergon and Government employees moving in late 2013. The Honeycombes development project continues to progress, with further residential offers to open in 2014, as well as a new 800 seat cinema and the introduction of a Max Brenner franchise. Discount Chemist Warehouse, Escape Travels, the City Lane complex and other retail developments are revitalizing foot traffic and the leasing intent on Flinders Street.

The falling Australian dollar should assist a slowdown in online internet orders, currently valued at approximately \$15 Billion. Australians are predicted to holiday at home instead of abroad as they have in recent years.

We could expect landlords to have to adjust rents downwards as vacancies start to appear and retailers get to cherry pick what is on offer when rent renewals fall due.

The Chamber continues to communicate retail concern about penalty rates, work cover increases, core trading hours as we have done the past year.

At 131 years of age, the Townsville Chamber is almost as old as Townsville itself and we know better than anyone how business is done locally.

Networking




